ORDER GRANTING BLANKET AUTHORIZATION TO IMPORT NATURAL GAS FROM CANADA AND VACATING PRIOR AUTHORIZATION

DOE/FE ORDER NO. 2637

I. DESCRIPTION OF REQUEST

On April 16, 2009, Weyerhaeuser NR Company (Weyerhaeuser) filed an application with the Office of Fossil Energy (FE) of the Department of Energy (DOE), under section 3 of the Natural Gas Act (NGA),¹ for blanket authorization to import up to 20 billion cubic feet (Bcf) of natural gas from Canada. The applicant requests the authorization be granted for a two-year term beginning on the date this Order is issued. Weyerhaeuser is a Washington corporation with its principal place of business in Federal Way, Washington.

Additionally, on September 26, 2007, Weyerhaeuser Company was granted authorization in DOE/FE Order No. 2413 to import natural gas from Canada for a two-year term beginning on November 1, 2007, and extending through October 31, 2009 (2 FE ¶ 71,515). On April 16, 2009, Weyerhauser notified FE that it changed its name to Weyerhauser NR Company. Weyerhauser requests that DOE/FE Order No. 2413 be vacated, upon issuance of this Order, because the proposed authorization will supersede the current blanket authorization.

II. FINDING

The application has been evaluated to determine if the proposed import arrangement meets the public interest requirement of section 3 of the NGA, as amended by section 201 of the Energy Policy Act of 1992 (Pub. L. 102-486). Under section 3(c), the import and export of natural gas, including liquefied natural gas (LNG), from and to a nation with which there is in effect a free trade agreement requiring national treatment for trade in natural gas and the import of LNG from other international sources are deemed to be consistent with the public interest and must be granted without modification or delay. The authorization sought by Weyerhaeuser to import natural gas from Canada, a nation with which a free trade agreement is in effect, meets

the section 3(c) criteria and, therefore, is consistent with the public interest. This Order authorizes transactions with terms of no longer than two years.

ORDER

Pursuant to section 3 of the NGA, it is ordered that:

- A. Weyerhaeuser is authorized to import up to 20 Bcf of natural gas from Canada pursuant to transactions that have terms of no longer than two years. This authorization shall be effective for a two-year term beginning on May 1, 2009, and extending through April 30, 2011.
- B. This natural gas may be imported at any point on the border between the United States and Canada.
- C. Monthly Reports: With respect to the natural gas imports authorized by this

 Order, Weyerhaeuser shall file with the Office of Natural Gas Regulatory Activities, within

 30 days following the last day of each calendar month, a report indicating whether imports of
 natural gas have been made. Monthly reports shall be filed whether or not initial deliveries
 have begun. If no imports have been made, a report of "no activity" for that month must be
 filed. If imports of natural gas have occurred, the report must give the following details: (1)
 the country of origin; (2) the point(s) of entry; (3) the volume in thousand cubic feet (Mcf);
 (4) the average purchase price of gas per million British thermal units (MMBtu) at the
 international border; (5) the name of the supplier(s); (6) the name of the U.S. transporter(s);
 (7) the estimated or actual duration of the supply agreement(s); and (8) the geographic
 markets(s) served (list State(s), U.S. Census Region(s), or general U.S. geographic area(s)).

D. The first monthly report required by this Order is due not later than June 30, 2009, and should cover the reporting period from May 1, 2009 through May 31, 2009.

F. Weyerhaeuser's blanket authorization to import natural gas from Canada in DOE/FE Order No. 2413, issued on September 26, 2007, is hereby vacated upon issuance of this Order.
